2. Take the ramp onto Wilmington Pike 1.8 mil
3. Turn right at W St Rd 2.6 mi
4. Turn right at W St Rd/Creek Rd - Continue to follow W St Rd 5.7 mil
5. Turn left at Unionville Rd 1.2 mi
6. Turn right to merge onto US-1 S - Entering Maryland 23.2 mil
7. Turn right at Red Pump Rd 0.7 mil
8. Turn left at Ridge Rd
9. Continue on Ridge Road in to the Horseshoe Scout Reservation. through the camp entrance gate, past the stone house and follow the road on

into the camp parking lot
